I as a Parent/Carer will:

- Encourage a positive attitude towards my child's education and our school. If I have any concerns, I will come and discuss them with you as it is much healthier to work out solutions and move on.
- Read all information sent home as this gives me important details of relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and open days.
- Support the school and the parents and the friends of the school association when fundraising and organising activities for the benefit of a variety of causes and also our school.

You as Parent/Carers will:

- Please support the school by making sure that homework tasks are completed and returned on time. This includes reading. A child who hasn't completed their homework is often an unhappy, worried one!
- Please use your talents and experiences to enhance your child's learning at home –
 Your child will benefit greatly from what you can show them, discuss with them and teach them.
