### **2. What do you enjoy most about your job at Friskney?**

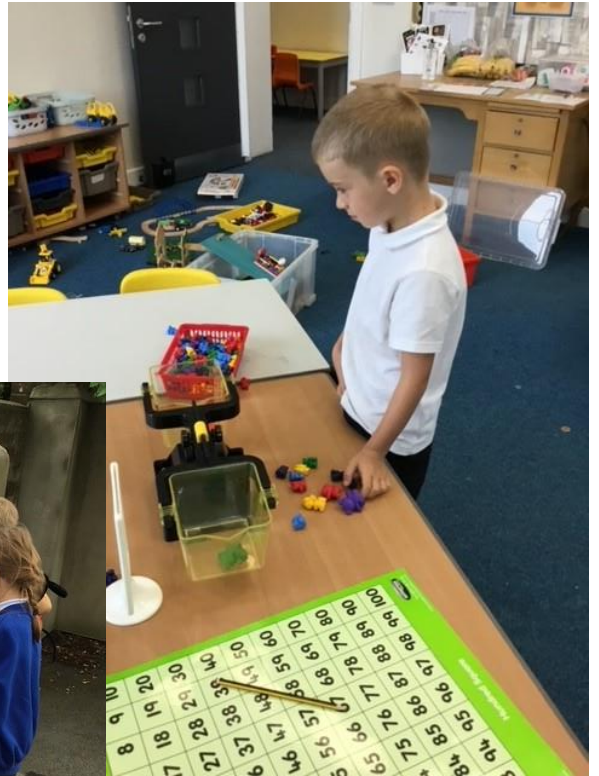
