We decided to catch up with Miss. Ross in Class 4 this week, to ask her some questions?

1. Are you enjoying teaching Years 5 and 6 and is it very different to teaching Years 3 and 4?

I love teaching year 5 and 6. They are now my favourite year groups to teach. The curriculum builds on the lower KS2 curriculum so it's just the next step on.

2. What have you enjoyed most about teaching in Class 4 so far?

I love their ability to use language. We've just enjoyed a unit of poetry and their final draft of their deep sea poems are just incredible. They've also created some stunning visuals to accompany them and their final pieces will soon be on display in the corridor.

3. What is your favourite subject to teach and why?

All the children know I love art. Art creeps into many subjects, it's a fabulous way to express yourself and show your understanding. I'll often paint or draw alongside the children, my favourite mediums are the oil pastels closely followed by the acrylic paint.

We also decided to catch up with Mr. Smith, who is our Area Site Manager, to talk about his job.

1. You are the Area Site Manager for both Friskney and Wainfleet, what sort of things do you have to do as part of your job?

My role involves lots of different jobs and tasks. The main part of my job is Health and Safety, Statutory compliance and Line Manager for the Site Staff. Basically, making sure the sites are a safe, clean and tidy environment for everyone that comes through the gates especially the children and staff.

2. Is it difficult working across two schools?

It is difficult and challenging working across two sites especially when I need to be in two places at the same time. Early starts and long days are normal but it's all worthwhile.

3. Which aspect do you enjoy the most as part of your job?

The best part about my job is getting to plan the exciting projects for the sites such as new equipment for the children to play on and use, so they can fully enjoy their time at school outside of the classroom when they are on breaks. It's a great feeling seeing the children enjoying the new equipment that you've worked hard to put in place.
