We had the most wonderful time last week for our Careers and Aspirations week. We had an amazing start to our week on Monday with a visit from the fire services and the police. Apologies to any near neighbours for the siren noise! The children had a brilliant time learning about what the emergency services do and trying their hand at using a fire hose and trying on a police uniform.



On Tuesday, we were privileged to have a visit from the Academy Trust's CEO Jackie Waters-Dewhurst. It was a really interesting assembly where the children heard what Jackie's role involves and her journey to get there. There were key messages for the children about getting past setbacks and that it's OK to change your career aspirations.



We also had a tractor visit on Wednesday morning and the opportunity to learn about farming. We all loved sitting on the tractor! The children were able to email their questions and were so pleased to get a reply!



Thursday was a STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) based morning for our older children. They were fortunate to have a virtual visit with a Prosthetic limb engineer who spoke directly to the children about her work. The children were then set the challenge to design a prosthetic hand that can pick up a ball. Not an easy task but the outcomes were superb!



An amazing climax to our week was the visit from wheelchair athlete Liz McTernan on Friday and the sponsored 'sports for schools' event. It was a joy to see a full hall of children giving their all and the support shown by their peers. Liz's inspirational talk to the children afterwards had some really great messages about persevering and not letting things hold them back. **Please note that any remaining sponsor money can still be added on the sports for school's website until Sunday evening.**

Health Visitor Clinic: There are many different health professionals within the Centre, delivering services such as midwifery and health visiting clinics. A health visitor clinic includes 6-8 week, 8-12 months and 2-2.5 year's assessments as well as 3-4 month contact.
